

## MUSEO CIVICO "GUIDO SUTERMEISTER"

The Guido Sutermeister Civic Museum was built in 1928 in the area of the old convent of Sant'Angelo.

In the building, that takes its plan and some original features of the XV century house of the Lampugnani family, are preserved archaeological materials from the town and surrounding territories. Those materials are mainly findings from excavation operations for the demolition and construction of buildings by the early 1900's thanks to the precious contributions of Engineer Guido Sutermeister. The collections thereafter were enriched by a consistent material nucleus that reached the museum from excavations performed by the Soprintendenza Archeologica della Lombardia and further donations.

At short distance from the Civic Museum it's placed the "Colombera", a renaissance tower building, compost by two floors, and named as such for the function this kind of structure often had as pigeon breeding.

In the Colombera tower are preserved numerous frescoes, mostly from the XV, XVI and XVII centuries, recovered by Guido Sutermeister in the Legnanesi noble houses before their demolitions and urbanistic transformations.
